Sue Hastings called the meeting of the Administrative Board to order at 7:05 with a prayer. The minutes of the July 13th meeting were corrected and approved.

Bruce McCrodden (Staff Parish) gave a review of the Charge Conference: The progress made in 2010, along with 2011 developments were discussed with District Superintendent, Orlando Chaffee, and two reports were submitted: Local Church Profile-Annual Information and 2010 Evaluation for the Continuing Formation of Clergy.

Financial Report: Shelly Meek reported that year to date we have a deficit of \$226 which is an improvement from last year. They have worked on the budget and anticipate an increase in expenses of 3. Total revenues to date were \$349,975 and total expenses were \$350,201.

Trustee Report: Jim Fredrick reported all major projects have been completed including windows, blinds, exterior painting, and repairs of downspouts and gutter. Projects underway include plaster repairs, building cabinets, replacing spotlights in the chapel, and purchasing a tankless hot water heater. They are also exploring installing an electronic eye in the elevator. A new boiler control system has been suggested.

Education Report: Jenny Gee reported rooms 402 & 404 have been renovated. CMAP curriculum covered relationships and members of the church were interviewed. The first round of Sunday School is finishing up. Fifth grade communion classes are being scheduled. They will be serving communion at the church and Chippewa Place. Sunday School money will purchase a well for clean water.

Evangelism: Kathy Goebel reported on the upcoming goals for the committee.

Missions: Janet Kleckner discussed the meal service at Brookside and supporting Ronald McDonald House. She asked the group to watch the announcements for future opportunities to serve.

Worship: Lynn Hobzek reported all church ware is being evaluated for replacement including new aspirators for communion. Right of Passage for 5th graders will teach them about communion and will begin in November. Ushers are now serving the dual role of greeters.

Gifts & Memorials: Kay AuWerter reported the starting balance was \$28,000; currently \$18,000 remains. The Church received donations for the last 3 windows and plaques will soon be hung memorializing the donors.

Music Board: Karen Schroedel reported 60 people were in attendance for first concert series. The schools have been notified about the series. The next concert is the brass quintet scheduled for November 20. Tickets are available to support the Board's annual fundraiser.

United Methodist Women: Ruth Holmes reported there will be a memorial for Gordon Markley this weekend. There are cherries left and cherry cobbler will be made for sale in November.

Youth Board: John Dietrich and Lisa Kropinak reported that fall activities are underway and attendance at both the middle and high school is increasing. There is a box for YSP and ASP memorabilia and photos in the parlor which will be used for the December 29th celebration of 20 years that the program has been in place. Health kits are being assembled by the students for distribution.

Sue Hastings discussed the MissionInsight software and encouraged the committees to become familiar with and use the software when planning for 2011. Examples of the demographic

information available with the software were distributed. Leaders were reminded this was an initiative by the conference and they could work directly with Melanie Smith to determine what information may be most helpful for their respective committees.
